

# NIGHTWATCH — Iran / Strait of Hormuz Crisis

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## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Islamabad talks collapsed. After a **21-hour marathon** — the highest-level direct US-Iran engagement since the 1979 Islamic Revolution — VP Vance departed the Serena Hotel without an agreement, leaving what he called a “final and best offer” on the table. Three sticking points proved irreducible: Iran’s refusal to provide an “affirmative commitment” to forgo nuclear weapons, the question of who controls the Strait of Hormuz, and Lebanon. Ghalibaf said the US was “incapable” of earning trust; Vance said failure was “bad news for Iran much more than for the USA.” No date or venue has been set for a second round. Iran’s Fars agency says none is planned ([Dawn](#), [Guardian](#), [DW](#)).

But the collapse may be partly theatrical. Anadolu Agency reported Pakistan brokered agreement for another round of talks Sunday. Iranian state TV reported negotiations would continue in one week. Technical teams remained in session exchanging expert texts even after principals departed. The “final offer” framing gives both sides domestic cover — Vance: “we tried”; Iran: “we didn’t capitulate” — while preserving a quieter back-channel. Watch whether Vance actually boards Air Force Two or extends his stay.

While Vance negotiated, Trump attended **UFC 327 in Miami** alongside SecState Rubio, telling reporters: “Makes no difference to me... We win either way. We have defeated them militarily.” Post-talks, Trump signaled a naval blockade as the next escalation step, sharing articles about tactics used against Venezuela before the Maduro abduction and stating the US is “loading ammunition and weapons on ships” ([Palm Beach Post](#), [Middle East Eye](#)).

Overnight, the Strait of Hormuz saw its busiest day since the war: **19 ships transited Saturday**, including three VLCCs carrying 2 million barrels each — the first supertanker passage since the ceasefire. Two US Navy destroyers (USS Frank E. Petersen and USS Michael Murphy) transited to begin mine-clearing operations; the IRGC categorically denied any US warship passage and threatened

“severe measures.” LSEG shipping data independently confirmed the tanker transits, cutting through the propaganda fog ([Al Jazeera](#), [Al Jazeera Arabic](#)).

The strategic landscape is shifting beneath the diplomatic surface. A major AP wire story detailed how the Iran war is **pulling US military assets from Asia-Pacific** — missile defense from South Korea, Marine rapid-response units from Japan — opening a window for China. Separately, US intelligence assesses that China is **considering more active support for Iran**, including MANPADS delivery. The de-dollarization architecture is accelerating: Iran’s proposed \$1/barrel crypto toll could generate \$140–160M/day at pre-war volumes; China’s CIPS now has 1,552 indirect participants; the mBridge CBDC settlement system hit \$55.49B — a 2,500x increase from 2022 pilots. SecState Rubio warned America’s ability to impose sanctions “may vanish within five years” ([El Confidencial](#), [Independent](#)).

Trajectory: the talks collapsed but the ceasefire holds (expires Apr 21). The next 9 days determine whether the “final offer” produces a back-channel deal, the ceasefire lapses into resumed strikes, or a frozen-conflict equilibrium crystallizes around Iran’s 15-vessel/day managed chokepoint. Trump’s blockade signaling — the Venezuela analogy — is the most dangerous new escalation pathway.

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## 10 MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

### 1. Islamabad talks collapse after 21-hour marathon — “final and best offer” left on table

The direct tripartite talks (US-Pakistan-Iran) at the Serena Hotel ended without agreement early Sunday. VP Vance, Witkoff, and Kushner faced Ghalibaf and Araghchi across three sessions spanning 21 hours (some Iranian sources say 25). Expert-level committees (economic, military, legal, nuclear) exchanged written texts. Three irreducible sticking points: (a) US demands an “affirmative commitment” that Iran will never pursue nuclear weapons or breakout capability, including surrender of ~440 kg of 60%-enriched uranium; (b) Strait of Hormuz — Iran demands sovereignty, transit fees in rials, and IRGC military coordination for all vessel movement; US demands unconditional reopening; (c) Lebanon ceasefire — Iran demands inclusion, US/Israel refuse. Vance departed claiming the US left its “final and best offer”; Ghalibaf said the US “failed to earn Iran’s trust” ([Dawn](#), [Guardian](#), [France24](#)).

However, contradicting signals suggest the collapse is partly staged: Anadolu Agency reported Pakistan brokered agreement for another round Sunday; Iranian state TV said talks would resume in one week; technical teams continued exchanging texts after principals left. Pakistan FM Ishaq Dar pledged continued mediation. The “final offer” mechanism creates slower-burn negotiation space while giving both sides domestic cover.

### 2. US Navy enters Hormuz for mine clearing — IRGC denies, threatens “severe measures”

CENTCOM confirmed two destroyers — **USS Frank E. Petersen (DDG-121)** and **USS Michael Murphy (DDG-112)** — transited the Strait of Hormuz to begin clearing IRGC-laid mines and create a “new safe corridor.” Trump claimed all 28 Iranian mineboats are “lying at the bottom of the sea.” The IRGC categorically denied any US warship passage,

claimed a US vessel turned back after a 30-minute warning, and threatened “resolute and strong responses” to military transits. LSEG shipping data independently confirmed three supertankers (Serifos, Cospearl Lake, He Rong Hai — each carrying 2 million barrels) passed through, consistent with USN escort operations. This is the most dangerous flashpoint in the ceasefire window ([AajTak](#), [Al Jazeera](#)).

### **3. Hormuz sees busiest day since war — 19 ships transit Saturday, still 85% below normal**

Al Jazeera reports **19 cargo ships** transited Hormuz on Saturday — the highest single-day count since the war began. Included 6 gas tankers, 4 oil tankers (3 crude, 1 bitumen), 9 mixed cargo. Three VLCCs exited the “Hormuz Passage trial anchorage.” Ships are self-identifying nationality on AIS (“Chinese Crew & Owner,” “Indian Ship/Ind Crew”). Malaysia sought clearance from Iran for 7 vessels. However, two supertankers (Agios Fanourios I, Shalamar) performed U-turns near Larak Island when talks collapsed — signaling the fragility of transit confidence. Pre-war norm: ~135/day. Still ~85% below normal. ~20,000 seafarers remain stranded ([Al Jazeera Arabic](#), [Live Hindustan](#)).

### **4. Trump at UFC while Vance negotiated — signals blockade as next move**

Trump attended UFC 327 at Kaseya Center, Miami, with SecState Rubio while Vance negotiated in Islamabad. “Makes no difference to me... We win either way. We have defeated them militarily.” Post-talks, Trump signaled a naval blockade as the next escalation step via Truth Social, sharing articles about blockade tactics used against Venezuela before the Maduro abduction. He also stated the US is “loading ammunition and weapons on ships” and warned China of “very big problems” if it ships air defense systems to Iran. The Venezuela parallel is ominous: blockade preceded regime-change operation ([Palm Beach Post](#), [Middle East Eye](#)).

### **5. Iran war diverting US military assets from Asia-Pacific — China window opens**

A major AP wire story syndicated across 10+ outlets detailed how the Iran war is pulling US military assets from Asia: missile defense systems from South Korea, rapid-response Marine units from Japan. Trump delayed the Xi summit by several weeks. Munitions stockpiles depleted — 1,800+ Patriot missiles used in the first 16 days, nearly double total US 2025 production. Delivery timelines slipping. Kurt Campbell: Indo-Pacific capabilities “might not return in full.” NATO SecGen Rutte warned of “multi-theater” conflicts where China uses “junior partners” to divert US attention. Xi has prepared a “war-time economy” with stockpiling and alternate energy. Separately, China is expanding Antelope Reef in the South China Sea: 1,490-acre reclamation with a potential 9,000-foot runway ([Independent](#), [Seattle Times](#)).

### **6. Netanyahu vows to remove 400 kg uranium “by agreement or force”**

Netanyahu released a video statement with a map of Iran, claiming “historic achievements” while insisting “this campaign is not over.” He stated Israel destroyed Iran’s nuclear and ballistic programs but **~400 kg enriched uranium remains** and will be removed “through diplomatic processes or the use of force.” He set Hezbollah disarmament as precondition for Lebanon peace talks. Israeli ambassador to France Zarka stated Israel is “ready to strike Tehran if necessary.” Israeli strikes killed 18 in Lebanon on Saturday alone, bringing the total since Mar 2 to **2,020 dead and 6,436 injured**. Israel-Lebanon ambassadorial talks agreed for Tuesday in Washington ([Live Hindustan](#), [AA](#), [Hurriyet](#)).

## 7. MAGA coalition fracture deepens — Carlson/Owens/MTG invoke 25th Amendment

Tucker Carlson: “I will do everything in my power to stop this, because it is madness.” Candace Owens and Alex Jones called for the 25th Amendment. MTG suggested a new political alliance between “rebel right-wingers” and the progressive left. Trump responded with a 482-word Truth Social diatribe calling critics “morons, troublemakers, and losers.” Despite the fracture, CNN polls show 100% of self-identified MAGA voters express unconditional support — but overall approval sits at ~39% (59% disapproval). The fracture is real but the base holds; the 25th Amendment threshold (VP + Cabinet majority + 2/3 of both chambers) is unreachable with current Republican majorities ([El País](#)).

## 8. Mojtaba Khamenei’s status: possibly dead — IRGC controls regime, Ghalibaf emerges

NZZ provides the most detailed reporting on Iran’s internal dynamics overnight. Mojtaba Khamenei, reportedly named successor on Mar 8, has not appeared publicly since the war began. Expert Ali Vaez (International Crisis Group): “It could quite possibly be that he is no longer alive.” The IRGC controls ~50% of the Iranian economy and maintains a 180,000-strong armed force. Commander Wahidi exercises effective veto over presidential appointments, sidelining President Pezeshkian. Ghalibaf is described by historian Arash Azizi as “the last survivor of the regime who possesses the qualities to be a leading figure.” This power vacuum means no single authority can make grand bargain commitments — a structural impediment to any deal ([NZZ](#)).

## 9. De-dollarization architecture accelerating — crypto toll could yield \$140M/day

El Confidential provides the most comprehensive reporting on the financial dimension. Iran’s proposed \$1/barrel crypto toll on Hormuz traffic could generate **\$140–160M/day** at pre-war volumes. Iran’s Shetab payment system is now linked to Russia’s MIR. China’s CIPS has 1,552 indirect participants. The mBridge CBDC settlement system hit **\$55.49B** — a 2,500x increase from 2022 pilots. The Russian A7A5 ruble-backed stablecoin processed **\$93.3B** in under a year. Sanctioned entities saw a **694% increase** in crypto value received in 2025 (\$154B in illicit transactions). SecState Rubio warned America’s ability to impose sanctions “may vanish within five years.” The US dollar’s share of world reserves has dropped from 72% (2001) to 57% ([El Confidential](#)).

## 10. Global economic cascade: Fed boxed in, GCC forecasts cratered, Patriot stocks depleted

The World Bank slashed GCC growth from 4.4% to **1.3%** — Qatar projected to contract 5.7%, Kuwait 6.4%. Germany cut 2026 GDP from 1.3% to 0.6%; France from 1.0% to 0.6%. Emerging market inflation forecast raised to 4.9% (extreme: 6.7%). The Fed faces a “double bind” (Ruchir Sharma, Rockefeller International): inflation at 3.3% with 60 consecutive months above 2% target; rate-cut probability collapsed from 84% to 24% in one month. Bank of America forecasts a 4M bbl/day deficit in Q2. US and allies launched **1,800+ Patriot missiles** in the first 16 days of conflict — nearly double total US defense production for 2025. Vitol star trader Yaoyao Liu suffered catastrophic losses (hundreds of millions) when his thesis — that Trump would back down — was proven wrong by the Hormuz blockade ([Maariv](#), [MC-Doualiya](#), [Futunn](#)).

## PIVOT EVENT TRACKER

### Pivot 1 – Does China cut a passage deal?

**Current assessment: YES – trending UP.** - LSEG confirms Chinese-flagged tanker He Rong Hai among first supertankers through Strait. - Crypto-toll and CIPS/mBridge infrastructure in place for yuan-denominated transit fees. - China receiving ~\$8.4B from Iran annually, increasingly in renminbi. - But: US intelligence says China “considering more active support” including MANPADS – could backfire.

### Pivot 2A – Saudi back-channel to Iran?

**Current assessment: YES – trending UP.** - Saudi East-West pipeline restored to 7M bpd – reduces immediate urgency but vulnerability exposed. - Pakistan deployed 13,000 troops to Saudi Arabia – mutual defense pact operational. - World Bank: Qatar –5.7%, Kuwait –6.4% – GCC economic pressure for de-escalation is extreme.

### Pivot 2B – Nuclear sprint to 90%?

**Current assessment: ELEVATED – talks collapse increases risk.** - ~400–440 kg of 60% HEU remains underground. Netanyahu threatens “by agreement or force.” - Iran’s Atomic Energy head ruled out enrichment restrictions. IRGC limiting delegation authority on the topic. - DNI Gabbard testified no rebuilding since June strikes – but talks failure changes the incentive calculus.

### Pivot 3A – Ceasefire deal?

**Current assessment: WEAKENED short-term – but back-channel alive.** - Talks collapsed publicly. No official next round scheduled. Fars: “no plans.” - But: AA reports Pakistan brokered Sunday continuation; Iranian state TV says talks resume in one week; technical teams still exchanging texts. - The “final offer” mechanism creates negotiation space without public commitment.

### Pivot 3B – US recommit militarily?

**Current assessment: ELEVATED – blockade signaling is new.** - Trump’s Venezuela blockade analogy is pointed: blockade preceded regime removal. - USN destroyers now in the Strait for mine-clearing – operational presence that could escalate. - But: 1,800 Patriots depleted in 16 days; \$200B Pentagon request signals empty magazines.

## Pivot 4A – China fills security vacuum?

**Current assessment: YES – accelerating.** - US assets diverted from Asia-Pacific (Kurt Campbell: “might not return in full”). - China expanding Antelope Reef with 9,000-foot runway capability. - De-dollarization architecture (CIPS, mBridge, crypto) advancing faster than sanctions can counter. - Rubio: sanctions capability “may vanish within five years.”

## CONTRADICTIONARY CLAIMS

### 1. Did US warships transit the Strait?

- **CENTCOM:** Two destroyers transited and began mine clearance ([AajTak](#)).
- **IRGC:** Categorically denied. Claimed vessel turned back after 30-minute warning.
- **LSEG data:** Confirms 3 supertankers passed — consistent with USN escort operations.
- **Assessment:** Physical transit likely occurred. IRGC denial is face-saving.

### 2. Are talks truly dead?

- **Vance/Fars:** “Final and best offer.” No further rounds planned.
- **AA/IRIB:** Pakistan brokered Sunday continuation. Iranian state TV: talks resume in one week.
- **Assessment:** Collapse announcement is partly choreographed. Technical-level work continues.

### 3. Iran’s military — “completely destroyed” or resilient?

- **Trump:** Navy, air force, radar, leadership “destroyed.”
- **Chinese analysts (Guancha):** Only 84 of claimed 452 mobile launchers actually destroyed. Iran maintained 20 missiles/day launch rate. US lost significant assets (4 F-15Es, 24 MQ-9s, 2 E-3 AWACS).
- **Assessment:** Iran’s conventional military severely degraded but asymmetric capabilities intact.

### 4. Lebanon ceasefire scope — unchanged

- **Iran/Pakistan:** Ceasefire covers Lebanon. **US/Israel:** It does not. Israel killed 18 more Saturday.

### 5. Frozen assets — \$7B agreed or not?

- **Iranian source (Guardian):** US agreed to release assets in Qatar.
- **US official:** “Groundless.”
- **Assessment:** Likely an Iranian trial balloon.

## 1. Talks collapse is staged – technical teams continuing – HIGH

AA and IRIB contradict Fars. Vance may extend stay. The real negotiation may have entered a quieter phase.

## 2. Trump naval blockade – Venezuela analogy – HIGH

Trump shared blockade articles post-talks. Blockade preceded Maduro regime-change operation. Represents a new escalation pathway that avoids bombing's political cost.

## 3. Mojtaba Khamenei possibly dead – HIGH

NZZ/Ali Vaez: "it could quite possibly be that he is no longer alive." If confirmed, succession crisis compounds all diplomatic tracks.

## 4. Iran mine locations may not exist – HIGH

Le Parisien: Iran may lack systematic records of mine placements. The blockade becomes self-perpetuating regardless of political will.

## 5. Kushner/Witkoff possible back-channel stay-behind – MODERATE

Reports that Kushner and Witkoff may remain in Islamabad after Vance departs, maintaining a quieter negotiating channel.

## 6. IRGC 15-vessel/day managed chokepoint – MODERATE

TASS: Iran transitioning from total blockade to managed chokepoint with crypto tolls. This is a doctrinal shift from denial to monetization.

## 7. De-dollarization "five-year window" – HIGH significance

Rubio's own warning that sanctions capability "may vanish within five years" is the most consequential admission from inside the US government.

## 8. Patriot depletion: Taiwan vulnerability – HIGH

1,800 Patriots in 16 days = 2x annual US production. US munitions stocks for a potential Taiwan contingency are being consumed in Iran.

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### INFORMATION GAPS

#### Is Vance actually leaving Pakistan or extending?

AA reports extension at Pakistan's request – critical signal.

**Mojtaba Khamenei's status.**

NZZ raises possibility he is dead. Who holds decision authority?

**USN mine-clearing: scope and timeline.**

Two destroyers entered — how long to clear? Months?

**Iran's actual toll collection infrastructure.**

Are ships paying? In what currency? Through which banks?

**China's MANPADS decision.**

Internal debate ongoing. Delivery would be a red line.

**Trump's blockade: rhetoric or operational planning?**

The Venezuela analogy suggests the latter.

**Technical team texts.**

What did the expert committees actually exchange? This is the real negotiation.
